



**Prof. M.-Saadeh Suleiman, MD, PhD**

M.-Saadeh Suleiman (PhD, DSc) is a Professor of Cardiac Physiology at the Bristol Medical School, Bristol University. Academic activities involve teaching undergraduate and postgraduate students in both the Medical & Biomedical Schools. Research interests are focused on investigating vulnerability to the damaging effects of cardiac insults and identify/design novel cardio-protective interventions. His work at Bristol resulted in key findings that influenced clinical practice in both adult and paediatric open-heart surgery. He is an elected Fellow of the following institutions: the European Society of Cardiology, the International Academy of Cardiovascular Sciences, the Society of Biology & The Physiological Society. Other distinctions include being a member of the team that was awarded the UK Hospital Doctor Award for Team of the Year in Surgery and runners up for Cardiovascular Medicine, member of the executive committee of the British Society for Cardiovascular Research and a founding member of the Bristol Heart Institute.
