



Prof. Jerzy Beltowski, MD, PhD
(Lublin, Poland)

Jerzy Beltowski is the Professor in the Department of Pathophysiology, Medical University of Lublin, Lublin Poland. His main area of interest is cardiovascular pathophysiology. In particular, he is interested in the role of HDL-associated enzymes (paraoxonase 1, platelet-activating factor acetylhydrolase) in the pathogenesis of cardiovascular diseases, hydrogen sulfide as the endogenous gasotransmitter, role of adipose tissue and adipokines in physiology and pathology of the cv system. Prof. Beltowski published more than 160 full-length papers which were cited more than 4000 times. He is the member of the editorial boards of several journals including Biochemical Pharmacology, Clinical and Experimental Pharmacology and Physiology, Lipids in Health and Diseases, Endocrinology, Journal of Clinical Endocrinology and Metabolism and Biology of Sex Differences and also serves as the regular reviewer in many other journals. Prof. Beltowski presented lectures and oral presentations in more than 40 international conferences. He is also the grant reviewer for national and foreign grant agencies (Italy, New Zealand, Croatia, Czech Republic, Slovak Republic). Prof. Beltowski is teaching Pathophysiology and Biology of aging for Polish and international students. He is the specialist of Internal Medicine and the member of Polish Physiological Society and European Atherosclerosis Society as well as the member of International Academy of cardiovascular Sciences – European Section.
